The criteria for competitive selection are:

- general and specific knowledge in the chosen field, confirmed by grades obtained at universities;
- diplomas or certificates indicating success in scientific and project work (conferences, publications, scholarships);
- scientific publications (scientific journals, conference proceedings, academic contributions etc.). The scientific level of the publication is taken into account (indexing, editorial board, coauthors, conference level, etc.);
- quality of submitted qualifying work on medieval studies;
- experience in the scientific or popular science field (teaching, journalism, blogs, art exhibitions);
- personal motivation of the candidate.

The maximum number of points for the portfolio competition is 100 points.

1. Documents and motivation letter. Maximum score – 60 points

2. Oral interview. Maximum score - 40 points

Applicants who, based on the results of document verification and a motivation letter, have

scored at least 20 points are invited to an oral interview.

NB It is possible to conduct an interview via Skype, webinar etc.

Approximate interview topics:

- 1.1 Questions regarding the content of the applicant's motivation letter: research interests and intended topic of scientific work; connection of future master's work with previous experience in study and work; What do you imagine your future professional activity could be?
- 1.2. Questions testing the candidate's knowledge of medieval history, literature, art or philosophy, depending on his/her undergraduate background. The candidate must demonstrate knowledge of scientific literature, monuments of medieval art, medieval literature, and medieval philosophy. Direct acquaintance with works of literature and other historical sources of the Middle Ages is encouraged.
- 1.3. Testing knowledge of a foreign and ancient language. The applicant may be requested to work with a short text in the selected language/s. After a little preparation, it needs to be read, translated, and possibly clarified. Knowledge of one ancient language (Latin, Ancient Greek, Old Russian) is required only at an elementary level, but its knowledge at a high level is strongly encouraged.
