The admission process for the Master's Degree program "History of the Modern World" begins with a "portfolio competition".

The examination committee evaluates all the documents submitted by you and individually considers all those who wish to be admitted to the program. After reviewing the documents submitted for the "portfolio competition" you will be invited for an interview with the academic director of the program.

Portfolio composition for foreign applicants to the master's degree program "History of the Modern World"

Main mandatory documents:

• *Motivational Letter (500 - 1000 words)*

In this letter, the applicant writes about his/her scientific interests and areas for future research, the expectations of the Master's program, further plans for development and goals after graduating, what theoretical and practical skills the applicant expects to obtain in the process of training. The motivation letter can be written in Russian or English;

Résumé/CV

CV (including education, language skills, list of publications, research experience, participation in research projects, conferences, student programs, research grants, and other academic achievements). The CV can be written in Russian or English;

• Recommendation letters (two required) (At least one from someone familiar with the applicant's academic and scientific accomplishments)

Recommendation letters of must be written in English and Russian and must contain specific information of the addressee.

• Copy of Higher Education diploma with a list of completed subjects and their grades (this list is usually called "Transcript")

If the applicant has not yet earned an undergraduate degree, he or she may attach an official copy of the complete list of courses with their grades. Diplomas of Higher Education from any major degree in Humanities are accepted.

Additional documents:

• Scientific works written by the applicant (as PDF files), if any (graduate works or dissertations are also accepted)

Publications and graduate Humanities dissertations may be considered relevant.

• Copies of diplomas and certificates confirming other academic achievements (victories in student Olympiads, student competitions, etc.); academic scholarships, study grants; language skills, advanced training courses.
